


Rates for San Mateo County Schools during the 2016-2017 School Year by Student Race/Ethnicity






Students who are included in the chronic absenteeism rate have missed 10% or more of the days they were enrolled in a school (when enrolled for at least 30 days).

Although the number of juvenile cases resulting in detention has decreased somewhat, racial disproportionalities among the youth who are detained have remained fairly consistent (and some have even increased).

As of 2017:

- Latinx children/youth in San Mateo County are 3 times as likely to be in foster care compared to white children/youth.
- Black children/youth in San Mateo County are 20 times as likely to be in foster care compared to white children/youth.
