


More than half of households in some parts of the CCCS focus area in Daly City include at least 1 child.

Percent of Households that include at least 1 person 0-17 years old by Census Block Group




Percent of Households that have Moved in the Past Year by Census Block Group






Demographic Breakdown of **Teachers**' Race/Ethnicity


Demographic Breakdown of **Students**' Race/Ethnicity






Graduation Status in June 2018 for 4-Year Cohort by Student Race/Ethnicity

Students who graduated with a HS diploma and met UC/CSU requirements




Even though Filipino and Latino students at Jefferson High have a similar graduation rate (88% for Filipinos, 83% for Latinos), Latino students are far less likely to meet UC/CSU requirements – in 2018 only 19% of Latino students did, compared to 42% of Filipino students.

Although there is more of a disparity in graduation rates for Filipino and Latino students at Westmoor High (94% for Filipino, 92% for Asian, and 78% for Latino students), the disparities in who meets UC/CSU requirements is even more striking: in 2018, 62% of Asian students met these requirements compared to just 39% of Filipino and only 17% of Latino students.

Although disparities are slowly decreasing, African American students at Jefferson High continue to be disproportionately suspended. Pacific Islander, Latino, and White students are also suspended at higher rates than their Asian and Filipino peers.

Suspension Rates for Jefferson High School Students by Racial/Ethnic Group




Who shared information about the CCCS focus area in Daly City?

CCCS Daly City data collection process gathered input from:


- 101 youth and 140 parents/caregivers through surveys (241 surveys in total)
- 22 parents and caregivers who participated in
 2 Tell Us sessions (small group conversations)
- More than 14 youth and 12 adult respondents via
 2 Dream Walls (posters with key questions)


Youth respondents ranged in age from 13 to 24 years old with an average age of 18.


86% of parent/caregiver respondents were a parent, 9% were extended family members, and 1% were siblings of the child(ren) they help take care of. The children they help take care of ranged in age from less than 1 to 25 years old, with the average being 10 years old.


Percent of Daly City **children/youth** who, in the past year, have been discriminated against *always*, *most of the time*, or *sometimes*...



Percent of Daly City parents and caregivers who, in the past year, have been discriminated against always, most of the time, or sometimes...










Frequency with which children and youth have experienced specified challenges and assets




They talk to me and/or other adults about how they feel. / For infants and toddlers: I am able to emotionally bond with them.




I or another caregiver actively supports their education and development
