
- May 2019 Presentation to YC on State of SMC Youth Health

Everyone gets the supports they need (this is the concept of "affirmative action"), thus producing equity.


Justice

San Mateo County Demographics


Population by Race County: San Mateo



Percent Under 200% FPL by Census Tract





Free/Reduced Price Meal Participation and 3rd Grade Reading Proficiency by School District, 2016-2017






SMC Youth Mental Health



Substance Use Among SMC Youth






