

Vehicle miles traveled are increasing








Concentration of Bike and Pedestrian Collisions

San Mateo County, 2009-2013




Concentration of Pedestrian Collisions

 - Pedestrian collisions: 19%








Vehicle right of way





Pedestrian right of way






Equity concerns

- Vulnerable populations include people of color, older adults, youth
- Hotspots were also correlated with higher percentages of households that speak limited English
- Blacks make up 32% of all bicycle and pedestrian deaths, but represent only 3% of the county's population



Safety near our schools





Recommendations

- Identify your community's values and priorities to better balance the needs of all roadway users.
- Adopt Vision Zero policies and make safety your top goal.
- Design your streets to prioritize people, not just cars.
- Create and track performance metrics so that over time, your community can evaluate how all modes of traffic are being accommodated, including cars.



Recommendations (cont'd)

- Focus on development near transit, especially in your community's downtown.
- Use existing streets more efficiently, and convert space to encourage growth while also allowing all modes to use the streets.
- Implement strong Complete Streets policies to serve all users of your streets.
- Enforce safety on the streets.
